The Village discussed no government funding really available for replacement or repairs on public swimming pools. They have not received an estimate from Ronnie Portz on cost but they feel it will be in the millions for a replacement. They received some quotes from Vic Allen Construction to remove pool and pump house along with filling in hauling away \$18,000.00, and remove tennis court \$9,000.00

Vic Allen Construction will clean out all the old mulch and get playground area ready for rubberized mulch coming in April.

The park will be getting bids for the upcoming mowing season.
