OLD BUSINESS:

The Village council and Ryan Linn went over the nuisance ordinance and how to enforce some of the issues. Ryan explained the chain of command is the Mayor Ron Davis and Village Administrator Ed Robinette that has the power to go after the properties in violation. The issue still is how far to governor the properties in violation. Ryan Linn discussed with the council some steps to put in place.

Step 1 adopt a nuisance complaint form

Step 2 Determine the degree and if they are in violation

Step 3 Enforce the issue

The council will decide to amend the original Ordinance 2009-09 to add Steve Kempf – Zoning in the enforcement. He will be involved in the property violations.

The Village council also has to keep in mind the cost is going to be on the Village to clean up the property and the time involved.

The 2021-2022 audit will be completed and filed by the next month meeting. The auditors would like to see a form for the amounts the village write's off. This will allow a chain of command for better oversight. The write-off happens sometimes for late charges removed or when in the system the bill is not shut off from the old owner to the new owner. The Village will now have a form that Fiscal Officer-Tammy Pope fills out and then has the Village Administrator Ed Robinette to approve.
